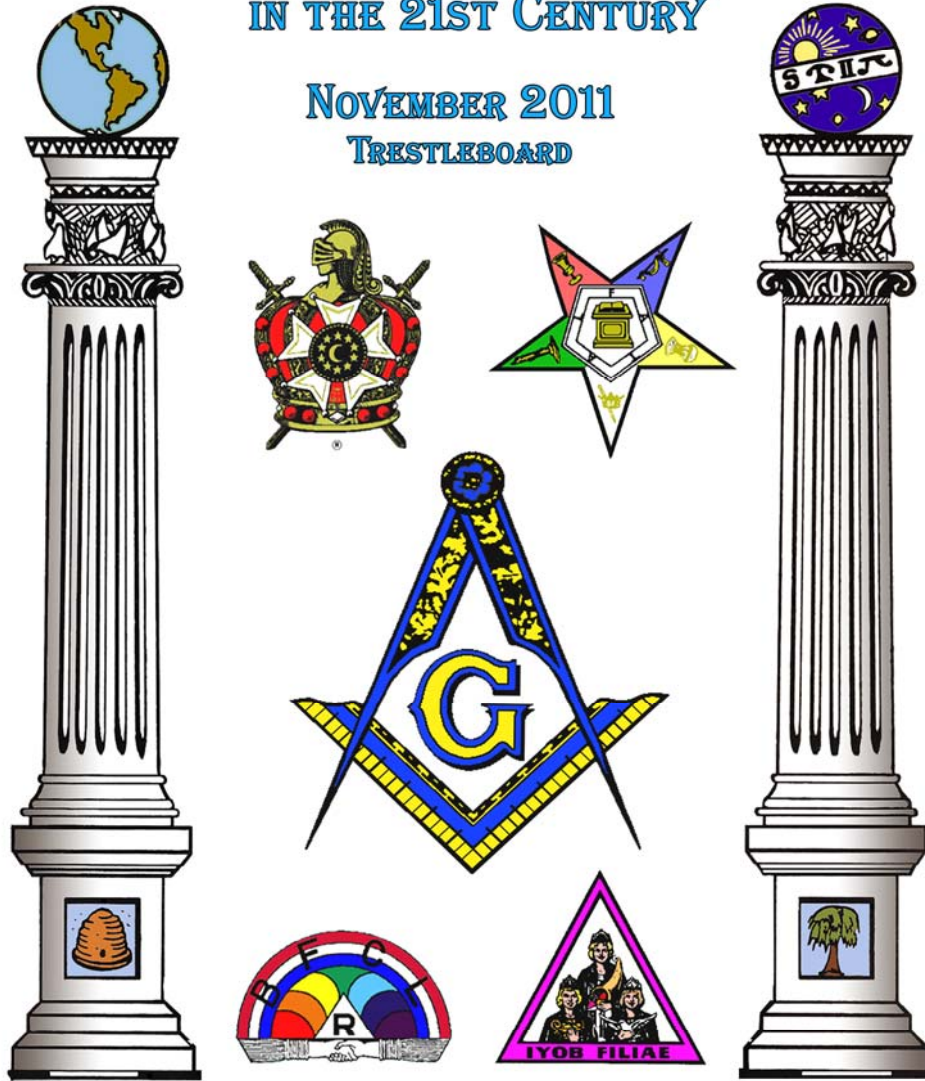

Grand Chapter is just around the corner and dues notices for 2012 will be mailed in November. Thank you for your assistance in getting your dues/assessments in on a timely basis.

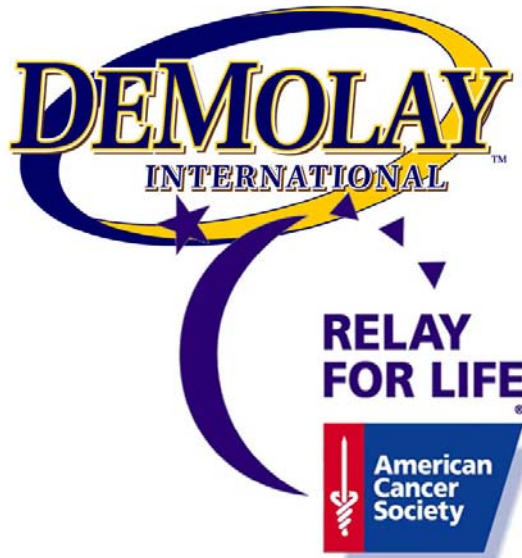
