TWO THINGS WORTH LIVING FOR

*"The labor of the righteous tendeth to life;
the fruit of the wicked to sin"*
Prov. 10:16

Masonic writings inform us that there are but two things worth living for: to *do* what is worthy of being written, and to *write* what is worthy of being read. The greater of these is *the doing*. No matter how magnificent and noble an act an author can describe or the artist paint, it is far nobler for you to go and do that which one describes, or be the model which the other draws. In other words, when we pause to look within ourselves to assess how well we are doing in living life, the standard by which every Mason measures his past, present and future worth is his work and example to others.

Our Craft teaches us that contributions to the best interests of our fellowman is the noblest work of all. In the great Providence of God, in the great ordinances of our being, there is opened to every man a sphere for the noblest action. More often than not, that sphere is not of extraordinary heights, rather it is borne of the exemplification of extraordinary virtues displayed during an ordinary life. It arises more often during times of silence and seclusion, in wearing sickness without complaint, displaying sorely tried honesty that asks no praise, and privately yielding advantage to another. It is natural that all men desire distinction, but those who seem happiest in its pursuit are they who seek to find principles, or attempt to develop beauty. Such is the true harmony of the universe. Every Mason has a work to do in himself, greater than any work of genius; a work upon a nobler material than marble or stone - upon his own soul and intellect. A great author or artist only portrays what man should be, or conceives what he should do, both virtuous and commended to our mutual admiration and imitation. Yet, the practical realization of the great

ideals of art include the exercise of love, piety, truth and right. They are displayed in the daily routine of ordinary lives and survive as a testament to the real character of a Mason.

Duty is with us always and forbids idleness. To work with the hands or brain according to each one's skill and capacity is more honorable than title and privilege. When we consider the world in its primitive creation, we well understand that God was wise to give us a dark mass upon which to work; an empty canvass upon which to draw the character of our existence. Man is thereby taught and encouraged to create as He creates, to love as He loves, and to add to the beauty of His splendid bounty.

When time has finally run its course and we have concluded this wondrous journey, who among our survivors will honor the memory of the riches we have accumulated? Who will recall that we lived a life of luxury? Who will want to recount the deeds of treachery that drove us to the top of the heap? Such things are but vanity and will wash away in our dust. But, what we do for others will live forever.
