## IN UNITY

*"Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!"*

Ps. 133:1

Freemasonry recognizes certain inalienable rights of men to have different opinions on many vital issues of life; the principles of freedom of thought and liberty of conscience form a part of the fundamentals of our institution. Genuine unity in mind and heart, and in the noble purposes of the Craft, is urged at all times. True brotherly love and genuine fraternalism are cultivated, and a community of interest among brethren of the "Mystic Tie" is maintained at all times. This tie grows out of the vows of eternal brotherhood, irrespective of differences in race, nationality, material and social conditions, and religious affiliations. Our devotion to these and other Masonic tenets has remained steadfast throughout times of greatest stress to our Nation from the Revolutionary War, to the Civil War and on into today. Throughout, the voice of Freemasons have resonated as sounds of reason during moments of chaos. Throughout, Masonic speakers taught that our greatest enemy does not approach from without, but from within.

In the work entitled *The Fire from Within*, Carlos Castenada hears these words from his teacher: "Self-importance is man's greatest enemy. What weakens him is feeling offended by the deeds and mis-deeds of his fellow man. Self-importance requires that one spend

most of one's life offended by something or someone." With the self as your focal point, you sustain the illusion that you are your own body; a completely separate entity from all others. It is that sense of separateness that leads men to compete rather than cooperate with everyone else. Likely, you have seen such people at your place of work, living in your neighborhood, serving on community boards, or regularly attending your church, synagogue, or mosque. While fortunately a rare occurrence, you have also probably seen such people sitting in your very own Lodge room.

It is essential that we each maintain a strong self-concept and feel unique. The problem arises when we misidentify who we truly are by identifying ourselves as our body, our achievements, our possessions and our personal dogma. Mankind's gravest conflicts have resulted primarily from an insistence that one point of view was right and the opposite point of view worthy of nothing less than subjugation or annihilation. If we as Freemasons voice our approval of such divine concepts as charity and justice, is it not our duty to conduct ourselves with love and fairness toward all whom we meet? Is it not our duty when we witness self-importance

### Details:

This competition is open to all Master Masons, with the exceptions of current Inspectors and current Grand Lodge Officers. The District Inspector will establish the competition date (during June), time, and location for his District competition and notify all competitors. The District Inspector, with suitable assistance, will select the Best Ritualist to represent the District. The Inspector will mail the winner's registration form to his Assistant Grand Lecturer, who will inform each competitor of the date (during July), time and location for the Regional (if necessary) and Division competition. The Assistant Grand Lecturer, with suitable assistance, will select the Best Ritualist to represent the Division. The Assistant Grand Lecturer will mail the winner's registration form to the Grand Lecturer, who will inform each competitor of the date (during August), time, and location for the Statewide competition. The Grand Lecturer and Assistant Grand Lecturers will judge the final Statewide Ritual Competition to identify the Best Ritualist in California. The Division finalists and Best Ritualist in California recipients will be invited, at their own expense, to receive their award at Grand Lodge (or presented to them at a later time). Contact your District Inspector if you have any questions.

spinning its vicious web to actively exert our own influence in an effort to promote cooperation and compromise? Is it not also our duty to know that we cannot always be right in what we do, think and say?

While Freemasonry was very active before, during and after our country's Civil War and speakers from various Grand Lodges around the Union pleaded for reason to reign, the wretched influence of self-importance prevailed and senseless slaughter resulted. The teachings of Freemasonry were tossed aside by a European continent boiling with self-important anger and resentment which led to World War I and the destruction of a generation of souls whose contributions to mankind will never be known. Faith, hope and charity vanished beneath the cataclysmic weight of World War II, as self-important tyrants scorched the earth in an effort to control other men's lives.

If you privately ask yourself whether or not your conduct, speech and thoughts are motivated by feelings of self-importance, what is your truthful answer? When you are perfectly honest with yourself, are you truly tolerant of another person's religious and political beliefs, or do you believe yours are better?
